Funding for Childcare

Here's how you can support our efforts to provide quality, affordable childcare services:

- Extend childcare funding.
 - o Some KY centers will soon lose up to \$25,000 per month, forcing us to close childcare centers.
 - o ARPA funding helped us increase staff wages while minimizing program tuition increases, keeping our programs affordable.
 - Loss of funding will result in significant increases in program tuition, limiting access for families most in need. One of our centers would need to increase rates by 67% to cover operating costs.
- Add another round of non-profit assistance grants to support youth programming.
- Increase Child Care Assistance Program rates.
- Make licensing requirements more efficient and consistent.
- Strengthen Child Care Assistance Program (CCAP) funding including expansion of available high- quality preschool, afterschool, and summer learning options for low-income families.
- Increase funding for out-of-school time programs aimed at closing the achievement gap.

MEETING COMMUNITY NEEDS

Serving people of all incomes, ages and abilities

- Kentucky's YMCAs serve nearly 400,000 people in diverse communities around the state. We bring together young and old, women and men, people of all faiths, backgrounds and incomes. YMCA scholarships, subsidies and outreach provide critical access to low-income families.
- The Y welcomes everyone! We provide activities for everyone, including afterschool programming, swim lessons, free health fairs/screenings, physical activity programs, nutrition advice, cancer recovery programming and more.

Serving vulnerable populations in our communities

- Children: Our Kentucky YMCA's serve over 160,000 children and youth. The Y provides a wide range of activities to foster healthy, productive children, including teen clubs, sports leagues, family nights, and community service projects. All youth activities incorporate the YMCA Core Values of caring, honesty, respect, and responsibility.
- Older Americans: Nearly 50,000 seniors, those over 65 years of age, participate in specialized fitness programs, social activities, and events provided by the Y, making them one of the fastest growing segments of our membership. The Y is committed to helping seniors across Kentucky continue to live full, healthy and independent lives.

Mobilizing community resources to meet community needs

- **Locally Driven:** YMCAs are created by the local community based on a regional needs assessment and are controlled by a local board of community volunteers.
- **Contributed Income:** Kentucky YMCAs receive over **\$6 million a year** in support from annual community contributions.
