CAMP TYPES

TRADITIONAL CAMP LOCATED AT RIVERSIDE PARK

Summer Camp is a time for kids to be kids, to play, to run and to have fun with friends. Time spent being physically active and social is more important now than ever before. That's why the YMCA offers day camps—to help kids reach their full potential. Through fun physical activities, kids learn about themselves and grow in self-confidence as they develop new skills and meet new friends. Day Camp At Riverside is an all day camp for children entering grades K-6.

DISCOVERY CAMP LOCATED AT THE YMCA CHILD DEVELOPMENT CENTER

The YMCA also offers a variety of Enrichment, Discovery, and Sport Camps. Campers can pursue their interests with new friends and learn new skills in a safe and fun environment. Enjoy a full day of active games, crafts, and fun. Discovery Camps are available for campers entering grades K-5th.

A TYPICAL DAY

One of the questions parents ask most is, "What will my child do this summer?" The answer is... A LOT! As soon as your child arrives, we pack the day with activities based around that week's theme. The program follows a rotation schedule so every child gets the opportunity to try new experiences and activities they know and love. <p>OPENING CIRCLE 9:00am-9:30am</p>	<p>The day kicks off with an exciting and energetic celebration!</p>
<p>ACTIVITY ROTATIONS 9:30am-12:00pm</p>	<p>Daily rotations will vary depending on that week's theme, but could include activities like archery, swimming, STEM, team building, outdoor education, and group games.</p>
<p>LUNCH 12:00pm-1:00pm</p>	<p>Children take a break to eat and recharge.</p>
<p>ACTIVITY ROTATIONS 1:00pm-3:30pm</p>	<p>Children are ready for more action and will rotate around the space to try new activities.</p>
<p>CLOSING CIRCLE 3:30pm-4:00pm</p>	<p>Children will come together to close on another awesome day at the YMCA!</p>
<p>EXTENDED CARE 4:00pm-6:00pm</p>	<p>A variety of activity options intended to engage campers individually or in small groups will be offered as we wind down from an exciting day!</p>

GENERAL INFORMATION

OPEN DOORS FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

We believe everyone deserves a Y, so the Findlay YMCA offers financial assistance to individuals and families who might otherwise not be able to afford membership or program fees. If you have questions, ask a staff member about financial assistance. It's easy to apply and the Y staff does everything they can to make the Y a place for all.

STAFFING

Our entire staff are subject to local, and national background checks, CPR and First-Aid certified and participates in an intensive week-long training program that covers safety, supervision, counseling and camp procedures. Findlay YMCA average counselor-to-camp ratios exceed a state guidelines to ensure that your child receives the best care and attention possible. REFUND AND TRANSFER POLICY

Deposits are non-refundable under any circumstances. At the time of registration, a deposit is due for each session for which the camper is registering. Deposit fees are \$50 per camp per session.

Up to two weeks before the beginning of the specific camp session, all funds, less the deposit, are refundable and transferable within other day camp programs as space allows. This includes camp balance dues.

Within two weeks of the beginning of the specific camp session, all funds are nonrefundable and non-transferable to a balance due or to a new registration. If a camper, without notice, does not attend a session for which they are registered, there will be no refund issued. In cases of homesickness, dismissal, or voluntary withdrawal, there will be no refund of any fees

A written physician-authorized note verifying illness or injury is required in order to transfer funds to a future registration once the session

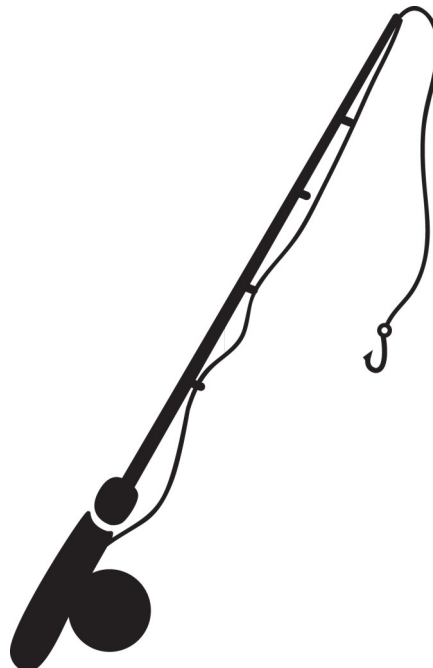
TRADITIONAL CAMP AT RIVERSIDE PARK
