Dear Y Members and Friends,

What an honor it has been to serve you during this tremendous year. In 2021, we gained significant momentum, continued to (re)open spaces/services, and had over 606 membership units return to the YMCA. We took solid steps forward...together.

Support of the YMCA was rekindled and this new energy helped us fuel success, raising over \$148,000 for our Spiritual Development Program Endowment, far more than we would have ever anticipated. By mid 2022, that endowment goal had been reached, as well as the full funding of our endowment for our special populations towel desk staff. These endowments protect our mission-driven programs in perpetuity.

Our robust community partnerships with area school districts and key foundations helped to ensure our children and families grew in their learning and were challenged in their physical health and well-being. We helped in a new way by feeding people during the summer months with more than 715 weekend take-home food packs for those in need. 2021 HIGHLIGHTS

 The Y is the starting point for many kids to learn about becoming and staying active! We provided youth an opportunity to be on a team and connect with their peers through flag football, basketball, volleyball, baseball & softball, soccer, track, golf, and sailing! Our youth sports programs promote healthy habits that they'll carry with them throughout their lives.



- The Y's home school program soared during 2021, nearly doubling in participation. Many
 home school students and families are looking for ways to make new friends outside of their
 remote home environment. The Y strives to create an environment that offers engaging
 experiences; keeping students active and helping them build solid relationships outside of
 their normal social circles.
- Watertown Summer Day Camp enjoyed a new location at Schurz Elementary offering a
 convenient setting for families and new opportunities for campers to get creative and
 enjoy the outdoors. A partnership with the Watertown Unified School District provided free
 lunches to camp participants as well.







ENSURING ALL KIDS HAVE THEIR BEST START

Together, the Oconomowoc Area School District and the Y's Sunshine School have teamed up to ensure all children have their best start for kindergarten.

The Y has worked alongside the school district for many years, but in 2021, an exclusive formal contract was established that integrates the expertise of an Early Learning Strategist into the Y's Sunshine School classroom. This program is available to young students who demonstrate delay during a preschool screening offered by the school district.

YMCA lead teacher, Carrie Hollmann, and the Oconomowoc District's Early Learning Strategist, Alyssa Coutts, make an amazing pair as they collaborate on lesson plans that best meet the needs of all the children in the classroom.

Young learners who have been referred by the school district benefit from a variety of therapies such as speech, OT and PT, in accordance with their Individual Education Plan (IEP), which are rotated into the Y's Sunshine School classroom schedule. These services are funded by state and local resources with no additional cost to the family.

In Sunshine School, one of the goals is to provide opportunities for all young students to participate in every activity, whatever their ability. The partnership with OASD solidifies these goals, meeting the students where they are at, ensuring that all can participate, and giving all students a strong start as they enter school.





PAVING THE WAY FOR NEW OPPORTUNITIES

For Mike and Stephanie Eckl, finding a place where their 4-year-old son, Grayson, could safely go to work on his kindergarten readiness was a top priority. Grayson was born with a congenital heart defect and spent the first 8 months of his life in the Cardiac ICU at Children's Hospital. After having 3 major heart surgeries, including adding a pacemaker, the Eckls were a little apprehensive about getting him involved in too many things that could potentially jeopardize his health.

However, after realizing his need for more social interaction away from home, and the desire to prepare him as much as possible for the upcoming 4K school year, they decided to take a chance and enroll him in the YMCA's Sunshine School.

This fully inclusive preschool program's main focus is on kindergarten readiness. YMCA teachers review basic skills, such as letter and number recognition, but do so in a way that feels like play. They also emphasize important social skills like sharing, taking turns, and engaging during circle time.

The Eckls were thrilled to discover the early childhood program through the Oconomowoc School District was partnering alongside Sunshine School to provide even more support for their son.

"Once we saw how much Grayson loved going to Sunshine School, it opened our eyes that we needed to let go of our tight grasp on him and let him start getting involved in other things with other children that actually let him be a kid," says mom, Stephanie. What the Eckls initially thought would just be a preschool program, has led to so much more for their son at the YMCA. Grayson is now also in the adaptive swimming program and plays t-ball in the Miracle League at the Y.

Stephanie adds, "The smile he gets on his face when walking up to the YMCA doors just proves to me that we made the right choice. His speech has improved leaps and bounds in the last 6 months, he's a social butterfly and being in the swimming and t-ball programs has shown us that he is capable of doing things we never thought he would be able to do."

The Eckl family credits the Y staff and volunteers with playing a huge role in their son's growth and change over the last year of his life. "From day one, we felt completely safe and comfortable leaving him in their hands. They've welcomed him with open arms and you can tell they all truly love what they do by the care, quidance and support they have shown him."

Because of the Y, Grayson has found a place that has helped him flourish in so many ways. He's acquired new skills that have helped him gain confidence and grow tremendously.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS

- YMCA360 was launched as a free member benefit offering more than 1,000 on-demand exercise classes and programs 24/7. This online platform provided another way to engage with the Y from home when members couldn't make it into the branch.
- Les Mills studio streaming was introduced at both branches, allowing greater access for members to enjoy their favorite Les Mills classes. Taught theater style on a big screen TV by world-class Les Mills instructors, the workouts are pre-recorded and play automatically at their start time. This has been a great option for those who can't make a live class or want to take the class in a smaller group setting.
- Pickleball continues to grow as a Y member favorite at both branches and is great for increasing muscle strength and hand-eye coordination. In 2021, dedicated times were added for beginners at the Pabst branch to learn the basics of this popular sport.







GAINING STRENGTH IN MANY WAYS

Kristi Scheunemann was a bit skeptical when her friend, Kaitlyn, first invited her four years ago to join a Pound Fitness class at the Watertown Area YMCA. She was looking for an easy way to get in shape and felt her options were somewhat limited due to her use of a wheelchair. Looking back, she now says that it was one of the best decisions she has ever made.

Scheunemann was born with a disability called Spina Bifida, and while it has varying degrees of impact, for Kristi, it means she is paralyzed from the waist down. With no feeling or movement in her legs, she uses a wheelchair to get around. But Kristi hasn't let that stop her from pursuing a healthy lifestyle.

Although it's hard to find activities that are local and inclusive to those with differing abilities, Kristi said the Y has given her a space to be herself. "Being a part of Pound Fitness has not only strengthened my core and body, but it has also helped strengthen my confidence, which is one of the main things I was looking for," says Scheunemann.

Kristi attributes her YMCA instructor, Maria, with taking on the challenge of adapting workout routines so she can get as much out of a class as possible, even making sure the music she chooses has a routine with lots of arm movements and easily adaptable moves. She adds, "I've honestly never really cared for working out, but being in Pound and having Maria for an instructor has made it more of a fun challenge!"

Kristi hopes that more people with varying abilities will see her health and wellness journey and be inspired to try something new, despite any obstacle they may face.



NUTRITION WORKSHOPS OFFER BOTH EDUCATION & INSPIRATION

In 2020, amid the widespread pandemic shutdowns, there was a heightened interest in cooking meals at home and eating to support good health. YMCA group exercise instructor and personal trainer, Sara Dow, saw an opportunity to educate and support the Y community. She created her own YouTube channel, Healthy Recipes with Sara, sharing videos which demonstrated how to prepare simple and nutritious recipes. She received a flood of positive feedback from Y members, who had viewed the videos, shared them with friends and family and were looking for more.

In 2021, the YMCA at Pabst Farms launched its first official Nutrition Workshop series, led by Sara, with over 30 participants – that number more than doubled within the first 6 months of running the program.

Sara, who went back to school to pursue her dream of becoming a registered dietitian, now also writes a bi-monthly nutrition blog called Education Bites for the YMCA, which allows her the ability to share healthy recipes and resources with the community. "I am deeply grateful for the opportunity to give back to the Y, who inspired my journey to help members improve their quality of life through the power of nutrition, exercise and community," says Sara.

With the enthusiastic support of the Y staff and community, the nutrition workshops continue to grow and evolve in collaborative partnerships. For example, the Smoothies & Salads workshop this summer will feature ingredients harvested from the YMCA's own community garden, tended to by the Service Without Boundaries group. This fall, nutrition offerings will expand to include youth fitness, nutrition small group classes and youth nutrition workshops led by a Youth Fitness Specialist.

Members have nothing but positive things to say about their experiences with the nutrition workshops. Registered dietitian, Tricia Helwig, says, "Sara's nutrition classes are for everyone – from those just dipping a toe into nutrition to attendees like myself, a RDN. Sara creates a welcoming, interactive space with great information and practical tips to apply what you've just learned. In addition, these classes provide an opportunity to build and strengthen the Y community by allowing participants to interact in a supportive small group setting."

Nutrition is and will continue to be a crucial part of a healthy lifestyle, in which Sara and the Y are committed to supporting for Y members on their complete journey from garden to fork.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS

- On November 7th, Paulina Ampuero and Antonella Campos arrived in Wisconsin for a four week visit from Valparaiso, Chile to learn and experience the Y and community. Filled with service, exploration, and relationship building, this visit grew out of our mission trips to the YMCA in Chile and partnerships with the Chile Coalition of the Y-USA and the Greater Ft. Wayne, Indiana YMCA.
- The first Movie Night Under the Stars was held in August, 2021 and offered a night of free, family fun in Watertown. This community event was so well received that it was brought back in 2022 in partnership with Bank First, the Watertown Regional Medical Center, Dan Stukenberg - American Family Insurance, and the City of Watertown.



Bruce Osborn, YMCA Director of Spiritual Development, wrote an incredible devotional geared to fuel
the pursuit of Jesus. Published in December of 2021, RE:New is a compilation of thirty-one of the
many devotions that Bruce has written in his ministry with the Y. Proceeds from the book benefit the
Y's endowment fund.

A SPECIAL GROUP WITH BIG IMPACT!

For many years, participants in the Y's Service Without Boundaries program have embedded themselves in the community by helping area organizations and giving back. Service Without Boundaries (SWB) is a day program that supports adults with disabilities through weekly activities at the Y and in the community, including regular visits to the Oconomowoc Library to dust shelves and work on special projects, sorting donated food at the Oconomowoc Food Pantry, and a multitude of other projects/activities in collaboration with Zachariah's Acres.

In 2021, a new opportunity to serve developed from an ongoing partnership with the Watertown Unified School District, along with a generous food grant from the Quirk Foundation. Funds received from the grant made it possible to provide weekend food bags to all Y campers as well as families in need in the Watertown community.



Each week throughout the summer, the SWB group would organize and pack nutritious, easy to prepare weekend meals, including fresh fruit and vegetables, into take home bags and deliver them to the Watertown Area YMCA Camp. The take-home food bags were distributed to camp families on Friday afternoons, and extra food bags were available for pick up at the Watertown Area YMCA for those in need in the community. The weekend food bag program was designed to bridge the gap between the meals provided by the school district during the week. It's estimated that 715 weekend food packs were provided during the summer of 2021 to families in the Watertown area and was so successful that it was continued in summer of 2022.

Service Without Boundaries, along with other offerings in our special programs line up, also have a broader impact on the families of participants by providing much needed respite time for caregivers so they have the ability to work and care for themselves and other family members, all while their loved one is cared for by Y staff. In 2021 alone, 28,512 hours of respite time was provided while program participants gained independence, made friends, and made a difference in the community.
