

### WHY OUR WORK MATTERS

### \$200

6 kids given the ability to recreate with peers in structured programs.

### \$55,000

21 families given the ability to reach their full potential through peer recreation, curriculum and mentorship regardless of family finances.

### \$17,000

30 kids were afforded the opportunity to play all summer, stimulate senses, stay off screens, improve their reading and build relationships at Summer Camp.

### \$106,000




