## **BUILDING LIFESAVING SKILLS**



Drowning has claimed over 2.5 million lives in the last decade and Florida has the highest drowning rate in the United States. The greatest losses **occur among 1 to 4-year-olds** and adults over age 65.

In order to promote water safety within our community, the Boca and Boynton Ys organized a series of free swim lessons for nonswimming youth during National Water Safety month. Between May 28–31, our Boca and Boynton Ys had the opportunity to provide over **150 free swim lessons** to non-swimming youth due to the generosity of the **Piedt Family Swim Scholarship**.

### TRANSFORMING LIVES WITH FREE CAMP FOR CARIDAD KIDS

Thanks to the generosity of our community partners such as the Community Foundation for Palm Beach and Martin Counties, the Batchelor Foundation, the Lattner Family Foundation, and the Town of Palm Beach United Way, our DeVos-Blum Family YMCA was thrilled to welcome 53 children and teens per week from the Caridad Center in Boynton Beach to attend summer camp at no cost.

These children, from families living at or below the poverty line, often face challenges

that can impact their physical and emotional health, cognitive abilities, and academic success. By attending our Y's camp, they engage in physical activities at least three times a week, promoting exercise and healthy lifestyle habits. They also participate in STEAM-based activities, drowning prevention programs, and field trips, all of which boost their personal development, increase selfconfidence, and enhance their learning and performance. "Summer camp for these kids is a transformative experience. It offers them opportunities they might not otherwise have, promoting independence, resilience, and a healthy lifestyle. These experiences contribute significantly to their overall personal development," explains Sandra Dejesus, Youth & Family Services Director for the DeVos-Blum Family YMCA.

### THE Y RECEIVES \$55K DONATION TO SUPPORT TEEN PROGRAMS

The YMCA of South Palm Beach County was awarded \$55,000 in grant funding from the Truist Foundation in order to positively impact more than 950 local teens with Y programs and resources. The funds will be shared between the Peter Blum Family YMCA in Boca Raton and the DeVos-Blum Family YMCA in Boynton Beach.

This grant aims to empower at-risk teens by equipping them with the tools and resources needed to develop skills for future economic success. This funding will enable teens from minority and low to moderate-income households to participate in Y leadership and workforce development programs at no cost, such as Y Leaders in Training, Youth in Government,

"Investing in our teens is one of the most impactful commitments we can make," said Bryan Hunt, Executive Director of the Peter Blum Family YMCA. "At the YMCA, we see firsthand how these programs empower young people to grow into confident, capable leaders. By providing a supportive environment and opportunities for personal development, we help teens build the skills and resilience they need to succeed and contribute positively to their communities."

A primary objective of Y teen programs is to prevent the decline of academic skills during long breaks from formal education and to ensure that teens have continuous access to educational resources and support throughout the year. By offering consistent learning opportunities, these programs help at-risk teens stay engaged in their education, graduate from high school, and transition to college or the workforce, ultimately promoting their long-term success.

"Equipping and empowering at-risk teens with the skills necessary to develop into our future leaders aligns with Truist's purpose of inspiring and building better lives and communities," states Jason Aube, Market President for Truist.
