LIVESTRONG AT THE YMCA: A Path Toward Healing, Strength, and Community

At the YMCA of South Palm Beach County, we believe in supporting our members through every step of life's journey – including the road to recovery after a cancer diagnosis. This 12-week evidence-based program is tailored for adults who are living with, through, or beyond cancer. It includes two 75 to 90-minute sessions each week, focusing on cardiovascular conditioning, strength training, balance, and flexibility.

Led by specially trained YMCA-certified instructors, LiveSTRONG at the YMCA ensures that every participant is met with compassion, understanding, and professional guidance throughout their journey. At the Y, we don't just support survivors – we empower them to rebuild and recharge. Through LiveSTRONG at the YMCA, cancer survivors take back their strength with expert-led training, proven results, and a community that never quits," explains Robin Nierman, Director of Community Health.

Thanks to the generosity of the Robes Family LiveSTRONG Fund, we are excited to announce that additional staff will be trained this summer, allowing us to expand our program to both the Boca and Boynton YMCA locations this Fall.



To join this life-changing program, participants must be at least 18 years old and have a referral and medical clearance from a physician.

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INSPIRING NEW LEADERS

Three decades ago, Ken Kaleel exercised at a gym operated by Bethesda Hospital at the corner of Boynton Beach Boulevard and Military Trail. It was convenient, located just down the street from his law office, but something was missing.

Kaleel grew up in Ohio, where the YMCA was a cornerstone, a safe place for families and individuals of all backgrounds to focus on healthy living and building community through programs and opportunities. Rapidly growing Boynton Beach had nothing of that kind—yet.

On March 5, 2025 the YMCA of South Palm Beach County recognized Kaleel with its Inspirational Leader award at the 23rd Annual Inspiration Breakfast in Boca Raton. Kaleel is a long-time community leader and the Association's former Chairman of the Board of Trustees as well as a key player in the opening of the DeVos-Blum Family YMCA, which celebrates its 25th anniversary this year.

"I was approached in 1994 or '95 by Neal Allen who was then the executive director of Boca Raton's YMCA," Kaleel recalls. "He said he'd been given my name when discussions of putting a Y in the area came up as someone who might be able to make it happen."

Though he jokes that he didn't immediately take Allen's call, getting involved didn't take much convincing. "The tenants of the Y were very familiar to me," he says. "I said to Neal, 'This is something we really need.'"

Kaleel lists the players who came together in the late 1990s and early days of the Boynton Y—Robert Hill and Bob Taylor who were CEO and CFO of Bethesda Hospital, Charolotte Weaver and the entire Weaver family who owned the land where DeVos-Blum Family YMCA sits, Randy Justice who served as the association's chief volunteer officer, Peter Blum who was a major benefactor and believer in the YMCA mission, Rich DeVos who was the founder of Amway and generous philanthropist, Todd Shuart who was the branch's first executive director, and others. What happened in those years around the 2000



opening of the DeVos-Blum YMCA was transformational, Kaleel says.

"We had no idea if our idea was going to work," he explains. "But with Neal's demeanor and Blum's belief, it was an unstoppable combination."

Some of the early Boynton Y supporters had lunch regularly as they worked out the details of the operation, which involved land deals, concerns from neighborhood associations, developing partnerships with area residents, and securing financial support. The efforts, however, were overshadowed by the payoffs.

"It was so fun," Kaleel says. "At first there was a lot of hesitation, but when it all started coming together, it gelled and flourished. Everyone was just so excited even before the building went up."

The grand opening saw hundreds from the community crowd into the gymnasium for introductions and speeches before literal curtains were dropped and the new facility was opened with fanfare and celebration.

Kaleel served on the young branch's community board before joining the association's board of trustees. "Being on a board, in my view, is all about developing relationships," he says.

Kaleel and his peers were witness to what's become long-standing events like the Annual Golf Classic, Halloween events, the breakfast event where he received this award, and programs of all sizes and varieties. His three children grew up in Y sports and camp activities—the youngest, Alexandra, enrolled in the branch's inaugural preschool class. His wife Rema taught Pilates classes, and son Nicholas worked as a lifeguard. Daughter Jacqueline became a longtime volunteer and served on the branch's community board.

"We also had the best staff," he adds. "When you have nothing, you develop the staff and create a culture that you can mold into what you want it to be."


As for the future, Kaleel believes even greater things are possible. He stepped back in leadership after his term with trustee board ended, but his enthusiasm remains.

"I'm one of those guys that believes you need to make room for others and bring in new ideas, fresh ideas," he says. "We built what I believe is the foundation of the Boynton Beach community, and, obviously, I will always support it."
